Keeping the Unity of the Spirit
Through the Bond of Peace
Romans 14

1. The summary of Romans 14 has been described as: "In essentials, unity, in non-essentials, liberty, in all things, charity" Use the pyramid diagram to map various doctrines (baptism, communion, Israel and the Church, end-times, church gov, etc)
2. Sadly, the two things Christ gave us to unite the church (baptism and communion) has led to division. Why do you think that is?
3. How does Romans 14 guide us in respecting the differing convictions of fellow believers? How can we balance our personal conscience with the call to unity?
4. What does this chapter teach about forming personal judgments on non-essential matters? How can we discern between essential and non-essential matters in our faith community?
5. How can Romans 14 guide us in building a church community that honors God not only in unity but also in diversity of thought and practice?
6. Michael Bird summarizes the dilemma of Romans 14 as follows:

"Paul is bent on stressing that Jesus is Lord of the weak (i.e. teetotaling Sabbatarian vegan Jews) and the strong (i.e., bourbon-sipping, Saturday-shopping, bacon-munching Gentiles). If God has justified them, they cannot condemn each other. If God has raised them up, they cannot put each other down. If they belong to the Lord, they belong to each other. If everyone calls him "Lord," they must call each other "brothers and sisters." If God has accepted them, they must accept each other."

How do we accept each other as we each have different practices?

7. Let's get super specific about baptism. Our church has a history of baptizing believers and infants of believers. What should happen:

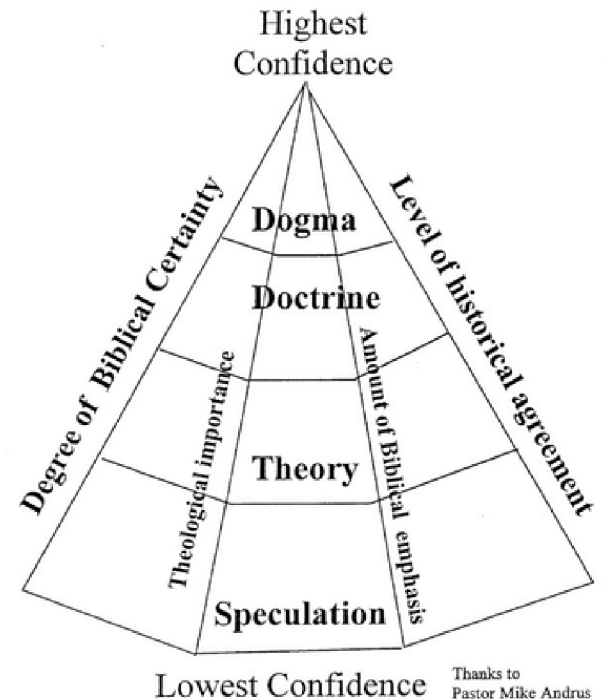
Person 1: Studies scripture, believes the gospel, holds our statement of faith, believes that only believers should be baptized.

Person 2: Studies scripture, believes the gospel, holds our statement of faith, believes that infants should be baptized.

Who should be allowed to practice their belief?

8. Reflect on a personal experience where you dealt with a 'disputable matter' in church. How could the principles in Romans 14 have informed your response?

Dogma—those beliefs we hold to be indisputable
Doctrine—those beliefs we hold to be well established
Theory—those beliefs we think may be plausible but open to debate
Speculation—guesses
