Sermon Discussion

Can you think of a time when you felt treated differently because of your appearance, status, or background? How did it affect you?

God's Heart for the Poor

James 2:5-6: Isaiah 66:2: 1 Samuel 2:8

Reflection:

What does this passage reveal about God's heart toward the poor, the weak, and the overlooked? Does God Himself show favoritism—or does He champion those the world rejects?

Application:

Examine your life rhythms: Whom do you gravitate toward in social settings? Who feels invisible to you? How can you embody God's love for the lowly this week — in your conversations, decisions, and use of time?

Challenge:

Make room at your table — literally or figuratively — for someone who brings nothing to "offer" but themselves. Pursue relationship where no earthly benefit exists.

Facing Our Own Partiality

James 2:4; Philippians 2:3-4

Reflection:

Is there someone in your life or church you tend to overlook or avoid — perhaps not out of hostility, but indifference or discomfort?

Why do you think you distance yourself from certain people? What fear, pride, or desire might be driving that?

Application:

Ask God to show you one person you've unconsciously dismissed. What would repentance and love look like toward that person this week — whether through words, time, service, or simply presence?

Challenge:

This week, initiate one act of gospel-shaped love toward someone you usually avoid or ignore. Make it concrete—sit with them, listen, serve, invite, bless. Don't wait to "feel" ready—act in faith, then watch your heart follow.
