

Questions about the sermon? Text the phrase SermonQuestions to 94000

- 1.If it was the last time you were meeting with Christians that you had mentored and shared life with, what would you say to them?
- 2. In Acts 20:36-38, the elders express deep grief at Paul's departure. Reflecting on this and Paul's praise for the Ephesians' love for all the saints in Ephesians 1:15, what does this tell us about the nature of their relationship?
- 3. Compare Acts 20:24 and Philippians 3:8. Paul seems to be saying he would rather lose his life than waste his life. Discuss the implications.
- 4. Paul is "compelled"/"constrained" to go to Jerusalem (v22)? What does it mean to live a life that is compelled by the Spirit without knowing what will happen?
- 5. Paul presses ahead, even though he doesn't know what is going to happen and imprisonment is possible (v23). How does this fit with Paul's views on suffering? (Acts 14:22; 2 Tim 3:12).
- 6. As Paul recounts his ministry in Ephesus (Acts 20:19-21), he emphasizes humility, tears, trials, and his message of repentance and faith in Jesus. How does this depiction of faithful Christian ministry correspond with the virtues Paul encourages in Ephesians 4:2-3?
- 7. In Acts 20:20 and 20:27, Paul declares that he did not hesitate to proclaim "the whole will of God." What does it mean to "not hesitate." How might you ignore or minimize what God has said?
- 8. What are the elders supposed to do (verse 28-31)? Compare to 1 Peter 5:1-5. Who are the specific people elders are responsible for?
- 9. Paul insists he did not covet anyone's silver, gold, or clothing but worked to support himself and his companions (Acts 20:33-35). Why did he support himself, and in doing so what accusation was he trying to avoid?
- 10. Reflecting on Paul's statement in Acts 20:35, "It is more blessed to give than to receive," how does this counter-cultural message challenge our modern societal values?
