


Sermon Discussion Questions

When God Spoke From the Mountain *Exodus 19-20*

- 1. What has been your understanding of the relationship between the Old Testament Law and the Christian life? Good for personal ethics, national ethics? Some good parts... some bad parts? At odds with the teaching of Christ?
- 2. How does God's declaration of Israel's past deliverance set the foundation for their future relationship with Him? See Exodus 19:4 and 20:1 Why is it important for us to understand God's saving act before diving into the commandments?
- 3. How do the first four commandments, which are vertical in nature, inform and undergird the latter six, which are horizontal? Or to put it another way, what is the relationship between our worship of God and our interaction with others?
- 4. How does Jesus' treatment of the Ten Commandments (See Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 5-6) deepen our understanding of these laws? Jesus summarizes the Ten Commandments as loving God and loving our neighbors (Matthew 22:36-40). How do the commandments provide a detailed breakdown of these two overarching commands?
- 5. Talk about these general principles for using the law:
 - a. The law is an essential part of God's intention regulating his relationship with Israel as a nation and is not transferable to the church of Jews and Gentiles in the same way (Acts 15:5; 21:20-21; 23-24)
 - b. The law is good for showing people they are sinners (Rom 3:19-20)
 - c. The law is a useful guide for the Christian life (Matthew 22:34-40; Rom 7:12-14; 2 Tim 3:15-17)
 - d. The law is weak in that it can not change the human heart (Rom 7:5; Romans 8:1-4; Hebrews 7:12; 15-25)
