Trusting God to Fight for Us - Isaiah 31:1-9

- 1. Read Isaiah 31:1 and 30:1-5 and 15-17. There's a saying: "There are no atheists in foxholes." Would Isaiah have agreed? Outside of Eden (after the Fall), do you think that humans automatically turn to God during times of crisis?
- 2. Read Isaiah 31:2-3. Why do you think God will make it his business to bring down Egypt? Do you think God acts the same way today in our lives, removing those crutches that aren't of him?
- 3. In what ways might you be turning merely to your own resources rather than to God? What's the balance between using the gifts God has given us [intellect, human agency, experience, etc.] and depending completely on him?
- 4. Read Isaiah 31:4-5. What features of the lion and bird imagery stand out to you? Why?
- 5. Read Isaiah 31:6-9 and Isaiah 37:33-36. How does God's defeat of Assyria remind you of God's work in Christ?
- 6. Fill in the blank: "God, would you fight for me in this area/situation: _____?" Share with your group.
